Nominations are invited for the Rank Prize New Lecturer award, this award is aimed at people who have been lecturers for 2 years or less.

**Nominations:** Applicants should submit a self-nomination with the same three components as for the MECEA except for component 2 the applicant should request a supporting statement from a head of department. These applications will be judged on the same criteria as the MECEA.

**Prize:** The winner will receive a £500 cash prize, plus up to £500 travel expenses and will have the opportunity to present their work at the 2020 Monogram meeting taking place at the James Hutton Institute and University of Dundee from 28th – 30 April 2020.

The Rank Prize Funds is a charitable organisation established by the late Lord Rank in 1972 to support and reward excellent research in the fields of Nutrition (crop husbandry, human nutrition and animal nutrition) and Optoelectronics, which relate to the two strands of Lord Rank's career (flour milling and film and cinema). The Charity awards a major prize in each field biennially and also actively promotes the development of research in these fields through a number of other initiatives, including symposia, Rank Prize Lectures, support for early career researchers in UK universities and summer vacation studentships.
